Proposed CRA II Agreement: Pingree 2000 Real Estate Holdings, LLC (Enterprise Rent-A-Car)

The City of Kent has received an application from Jon Zuccola, requesting a real property tax exemption under the City's Community Reinvestment Area (CRA) program, to perform renovations to the existing building at 1225 West Main Street for the consolidation of two of its Enterprise Rent-A-Car locations, including its current Kent location that is operating across the street. The property is located within the City's CRA II area, which requires Council approval of the real property exemption prior to executing the agreement.

The applicant is proposing a real property investment of \$2,276,762 which includes \$650,000 for property acquisition and \$1,626,762 for the renovations to the existing building. This total excludes additional investments of \$12,000,000, \$90,000, and \$40,000 respectively, for additional inventory, furniture and fixtures, and machinery and equipment, none of which are eligible for real property tax exemption.

In addition to the real property investment, the applicant will be relocating a total of 3 full-time and 77 part-time jobs to Kent, which represents a total annual payroll of \$1,391,822. The requested exemption is for 75% of the real property taxes associated with the increase in the assessed valuation resulting from the proposed improvements. The applicant is seeking a 75% exemption for a period of twelve (12) years.

In accordance with the CRA requirements delineated in the Ohio Revised Code, the City has notified the Kent City School Board of the proposed real property tax exemption, but the agreement does not require separate approval from the Board because the requested exemption does not exceed 75% of the increase in the assessed valuation.

I am respectfully requesting time at the November 5, 2025 Council Committee session to discuss this item in more detail and to request Council's authorization, with emergency, to enter into an agreement with Pingree 2000 Real Estate Holdings, LLC (DBA Enterprise Rent-A-Car) for the requested CRA II real property tax exemption.

COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AREA (CRA) AGREEMENT

This agreement made and entered into as of _________, 2025 by and between the City of Kent, Ohio, a municipal corporation, with its main offices located at 319 South Water Street, Kent, Ohio 44240 (hereinafter referred to as "Kent" or "the City") and Pingree 2000 Real Estate Holdings, LLC, a real estate holding company with its main office located at 8249 Mohawk Drive, Strongsville, Ohio 44136, (hereinafter referred to as "Pingree") and CLERAC, LLC,, also known as Enterprise Holdings, LLC, an operating company with its main office located at 600 Corporate Park Drive, Saint Louis, Missouri 63105, (hereinafter referred to as "Enterprise"). WITNESSETH;

WHEREAS, the City has encouraged the acquisition and redevelopment of real property located in the area described in <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto and designated as Community Reinvestment Area II; and

WHEREAS Pingree and Enterprise are desirous to renovate the existing building at 1225 West Main Street, Kent, Ohio 44240, hereinafter referred to as the "PROJECT," within the boundaries of the aforementioned Community Reinvestment Area, provided that the appropriate development incentives are available to support the economic viability of said PROJECT; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Kent, Ohio, by Ordinance No 2005-55, passed June 15, 2005, designated the area as a "Community Reinvestment Area," pursuant to Chapter 3735 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, effective July 12, 2005, the Director of the State of Ohio Department of Development determined that the aforementioned area designated as Community Reinvestment Area II in said Ordinance No. 2005-55 contained the characteristics set forth in Section 3735.66 of the Ohio Revised Code and confirmed said area as a Community Reinvestment Area under said Chapter 3735; and

WHEREAS, the City, having appropriate authority for the stated type of project, is desirous of providing the Company with incentives available for the development of the PROJECT in Community Reinvestment Area II under Chapter 3735 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, Pingree and Enterprise have submitted a proposed agreement application to the City, a copy of which is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u> (the "APPLICATION"); and

WHEREAS, the Director of Community Development of the City has investigated the application of Pingree and Enterprise and has recommended the same to the Council of the City on the basis that Pingree and Enterprise are qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create and preserve employment opportunities in said Community Reinvestment Area and improve the economic climate of the City; and

WHEREAS, the project site as proposed by Pingree and Enterprise, is located in the Kent City School District and the Board of Education of the Kent City School District has been notified in accordance with Section 5709.83 and been given a copy of the Application, and, pursuant to Section 3735.671(A)(2), no approval is required; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3735.67(A), and in conformance with the format required under Section 3735.671, of the Ohio Revised Code, the parties hereto desire to set forth an agreement with respect to matters hereinafter contained;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained and the benefit to be derived by the parties from the execution hereof, the parties herein agree as follows:

1. Pingree and Enterprise shall renovate the existing building at 1225 West Main Street, Kent, Ohio 44240 (PROJECT). The PROJECT will involve a total investment by Pingree and Enterprise of approximately fourteen million, four hundred and six thousand, seven hundred and sixty-two dollars (\$14,406,762.00), plus or minus 10% at the project site. Included in this investment are six hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$650,000) for the acquisition of the land and the building, approximately one million, six hundred and twenty-six thousand, seven hundred and sixty-two dollars (\$1,626,762.00) for the existing building renovations, approximately forty thousand dollars (\$40,000.00) for machinery and equipment, approximately ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000.00) for the acquisition of furniture and fixtures and twelve million dollars (\$12,000,000.00) of vehicle inventory.

The improvements are to be made on the property listed as **Permanent Parcel Numbers 17-028-20-00-121-001** on the real property list of the Portage County Auditor.

The PROJECT will begin after the date hereof and all renovation and construction will be complete by August 2026.

2. Pingree and Enterprise shall relocate to the City, within a time period not exceeding thirty-six (36) months after the completion of construction and renovation of the aforesaid facility, three (3) full-time jobs and seventy-seven (77) part-time jobs and retain six (9) full-time jobs and one (1) part-time job at the project site.

Pingree and Enterprise currently have five hundred ninety-four (594) full-time permanent employees and three hundred five (305) part-time permanent employees in the State of Ohio.

The relocation of three (3) new full-time employees and seventy-seven (77) new part-time employees in Kent will result in approximately **one million three hundred ninety-one thousand eight hundred twenty-two dollars (\$1,391,822)** of additional annual payroll in the City for Pingree and Enterprise. The retention of the existing jobs in the State of Ohio will assist Pingree and Enterprise in maintaining one million, seven hundred and thirty-eight thousand, eighteen dollars (\$1,738,018) of existing payroll of its current annual payroll of forty-one million, fifty thousand, nine hundred and fifty-five dollars (\$41,050,955) in the State of Ohio. Total payroll in the State of Ohio expected after the period of job creation ends is forty-one million, one hundred and three thousand, ninety-six dollars (\$41,103,096).

- 3. Pingree and Enterprise shall provide to the City of Kent Tax Incentive Review Council any information reasonably required by the Council to evaluate the property owners' compliance with the agreement, including returns filed pursuant to Section 5711.02 of the Ohio Revised Code, if requested by the Council.
- 4. The City hereby grants Pingree and Enterprise an exemption from real property taxation of 75% of the increase in the assessed valuation resulting from improvements to the real property described in Exhibit B hereto that is completed after the date hereof pursuant to Section 3735.67 of the Ohio Revised Code for a period of twelve (12) years. The exemption commences the first year for which the real property would first be taxable were that property not exempted from taxation. No exemption shall commence after December 31, 2026 nor extend beyond December 31, 2038.

Pingree and Enterprise must file the appropriate tax forms with the Portage County Auditor to effect and maintain the exemptions covered by this agreement.

- 5. Pingree and Enterprise shall pay such real property taxes as are not exempted under this agreement and are charged against Permanent Parcel Number 17-028-20-00-121-001 and shall file all tax reports and returns as required by law. If Pingree and Enterprise fail to pay such taxes or file such returns and reports, the exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement may be rescinded beginning with the year for which such taxes are charged or such reports or returns are required to be filed and thereafter.
- 6. The City shall perform such acts as are reasonably necessary or appropriate to effect, claim, reserve, and maintain exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement including, without limitation, joining in the execution of all documentation and providing any necessary certificates required in connection with such exemptions.

- 7. If for any reason the Community Reinvestment Area designation expires, the Director of the State of Ohio Department of Development revokes certification of the area, or the City revokes the designation of the area, entitlements granted under this agreement shall continue for the number of years specified under this agreement, unless Pingree and Enterprise materially fail to fulfill their obligations under this agreement and the City terminates or modifies the exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement.
- 8. If Pingree and Enterprise materially fail to fulfill their obligations under this agreement, or if the City reasonably determines that the certification as to delinquent taxes required by this agreement is fraudulent, the City may thereafter terminate or modify the exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement, and may require the repayment of the amount of taxes that would have been payable had the property not been exempted from taxation under this agreement.
- 9. Pingree and Enterprise hereby certify that at the time this agreement is executed, they do not owe any delinquent real or tangible personal property taxes to any taxing authority of the State of Ohio, and do not owe delinquent taxes for which it is liable under Chapter 5733, 5735, 5739, 5741, 5743, 5747, or 5753 of the Ohio Revised Code, or, if such delinquent taxes are owed, Pingree and Enterprise currently are paying the delinquent taxes pursuant to an undertaking enforceable by the State of Ohio or an agent or instrumentality thereof, has filed a petition in bankruptcy under 11 U.S.C.A. 101, et seq., or such a petition has been filed against it. For the purposes of the certification, delinquent taxes are taxes that remain unpaid on the latest day prescribed for payment without penalty under the chapter of the Ohio Revised Code governing payment of those taxes.
- 10. Pingree and Enterprise and the City acknowledge that this agreement must be approved by formal action of the legislative authority of the City as a condition for the agreement to take effect. This agreement takes effect upon such approval.
- 11. Exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement shall be revoked if it is determined that Pingree and Enterprise, any successor property owner, or any related member (as those terms are defined in Section 3735.671 of the Ohio Revised Code) has violated the prohibition against entering into this agreement under Division (E) of Section 3735.671 or Section 5709.62 or 5709.63 of the Ohio Revised Code prior to the time prescribed by that division or either of those sections.
- 12. Pingree and Enterprise affirmatively covenant that they have not knowingly made any false statements to the State of Ohio or the City of Kent in the process of obtaining approval of the Community Reinvestment Area incentives. If Pingree and Enterprise have knowingly made a false statement to the State or City to obtain the Community Reinvestment Area incentives, the party making such false

statement shall be required to immediately return any monies received under this agreement, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 9.66(C)(2) and shall be ineligible for any future economic development assistance from the State, any state agency or a political subdivision, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 9.66(C)(1). Any person who knowingly makes a false statement to secure economic development assistance may be guilty of falsification, a misdemeanor of the first degree, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 2921.13(A)(4), which is punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000 and/or a term of imprisonment of not more than six (6) months.

- 13. This agreement is not transferable or assignable without the express, written approval of the City.
- 14. This agreement shall be binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of, the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.
- 15. This agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which, when so executed, shall be deemed an original, and all of which shall together constitute one and the same document, and shall be binding on the signatories; and the signature of any party to any counterpart shall be deemed a signature to, and may be appended to, any other counterpart.

ORDINANCE NO. 2005-

AN ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING SECTIONS 3735.65 THROUGH 3735.70 OF THE OHIO REVISED CODE, ESTABLISHING AND DESCRIBING THE BOUNDARIES OF COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AREA IN THE CITY OF KENT, OHIO AND DESIGNATING A HOUSING OFFICER TO ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM AND CREATING A COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT HOUSING COUNCIL AND A TAX INCENTIVES REVIEW COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Kent (hereinafter "Council") desires to pursue all reasonable and legitimate incentive measures to assist and encourage development in specific areas of the City of Kent that have not enjoyed reinvestment from remodeling or new construction;

WHEREAS, a survey of housing (see Exhibit A) as required by Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 3735.66 has been prepared for the area to be included in the proposed Community Reinvestment Area;

WHEREAS, the maintenance of existing and construction of new structures in such area would serve to encourage economic stability, maintain real property values, and generate new employment opportunities; and

WHEREAS, the remodeling of existing structures and the construction of new structures in this Community Reinvestment Area constitutes a public purpose for which real property tax exemptions may be granted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Kent, Portage County, Ohio, at least a majority (5) of all members elected thereto concurring:

<u>Section 1:</u> The area designated as the City of Kent Community Reinvestment Area II constitutes an area in which housing facilities or structures of historical significance are located, and in which new construction or repair of existing facilities has been discouraged:

<u>Section 2:</u> Pursuant to ORC Section 3735.66, City of Kent Community Reinvestment Area II, is hereby established in the following described area:

The district is generally defined on both the north and south by properties, in whole or in part, that front on, or are within 300 feet of, West Main Street, or front on North Frances Street. The district extends from the Summit/Portage County line on the west to approximately 150 feet northeast of the intersection of Haymaker Parkway and West Main Street in Kent, Portage County, Ohio.

The Community Reinvestment Area is approximately depicted as the crosshatched area on the map attached to this Ordinance, marked Exhibit B, and by this reference incorporated herein.

Only residential, commercial and/or industrial properties consistent with the applicable zoning regulations within the designated Community Reinvestment Area will be eligible for tax exemptions under this Program.

Section 3: All properties identified in Exhibit B, the "General Boundary Description Map" as being within the designated Community Reinvestment Area are eligible for this incentive. This proposal is a public/private partnership intended to promote and expand conforming uses in the designated area. As part of the project, the City of Kent Intends to undertake supporting public improvements in the designated area.

<u>Section 4:</u> Within the Community Reinvestment Area, the percentage of the tax exemption on the increase in the assessed valuation resulting from improvements to commercial and industrial real property and the term

of those exemptions shall be negotiated on a case-by-case basis in advance of construction or remodeling occurring according to the rules outlined in the ORC Section 3765.67. The results of the negotiation as approved by this Council will be set in writing in a Community Reinvestment Area Agreement as outlined in ORC Section 3735.671. For residential property, a tax exemption on the increase in the assessed valuation resulting from improvements as described in ORC Section 3735.67 shall be granted upon proper application by the property owner and certification thereof by the designated Housing Office for the following periods. Residential applications must be filled with the Housing Officer no later than six months after construction completion.

- (a) An abatement of up to 75% for a term of five (5) years, for the remodeling of dwellings and upon which the cost of remodeling is at least \$2,500, as described in ORC Section 3735.67.
- (b) An abatement of up to 75% for a term of up to twelve (12) years for existing commercial and industrial facilities which shall be negotiated on a case-by-case basis in advance of construction or remodeling occurring.
- (c) An abatement of up to 75% for a term of up to fifteen (15) years for new commercial or industrial facilities as contemplated in the City of Kent Bicentennial Plan, and specifically stated in the Design Guidelines Manual: West Main Street Corridor, City of Kent, Ohio, which shall be negotiated on a case-by-case basis in advance of construction occurring. For those project involving the construction of three or more new residential units, the agreement is subject to prior approval by the Board of Education.

If remodeling qualifies for an exemption, during the period of the exemption, the exempted percentage of the dollar amount of the increase in market value of the structure shall be exempt from real property taxation. If new construction qualifies for an exemption, during the period of the exemption the exempted percentage of the structure shall not be considered to be an improvement on the land on which it is located for the purpose of real property taxation.

<u>Section 5</u>: All commercial and industrial projects are required to comply with the state application fee requirements of ORC Section 3735.672 (C).

<u>Section 6:</u> To administer and implement the provisions of this Ordinance, the City of Kent Director of Community Development, is designated as the Housing Officer as described in Sections 3735.65 through 3735.70.

Section 7: That a "Community Reinvestment Area Housing Council" shall be created, consisting of two members appointed by the Mayor of the City of Kent, two members appointed by the Council of the City of Kent and one member appointed by the Planning Commission of the City of Kent. The majority of the members shall then appoint two additional members who shall be residents within the area. Terms of the members of the Council shall be for three years. An unexpired term resulting from a vacancy in the Council shall be filled in the same manner as the initial appointment was made.

A Tax Incentive Review Council shall be established pursuant to ORC Section 5709.85 and shall consist of three representatives appointed by the Board of County Commissioners, two representatives of the City of Kent, appointed by the City Manager Council concurrence, the county auditor or designee and a representative of each affected Board of Education. At least two members must be residents of the City of Kent. The Tax Incentive Review Council shall review annually the compliance of all agreements involving the granting of exemptions for commercial or industrial real property improvements under Section 3735.671, of the ORC and make written recommendations to the Council as to continuing, modifying or terminating said agreement based upon the performance of the agreement.

<u>Section 8:</u> The council reserves the right to re-evaluate the designation of the City of Kent Community Reinvestment Area II after December 31, 2015, at which time the Council may direct the Housing Officer not to accept any new applications for exemptions as described in Section 3735.67 of the ORC.

<u>Section 9:</u> The Community Reinvestment Area Council shall make an annual inspection of the properties within the district for which an exemption has been granted under Section 3735.67 of the ORC. The council shall also hear appeals under 3735.70, of the ORC.

Section 10: The City Manager of the City of Kent is hereby directed and authorized to petition the Director of Development to confirm the findings contained within this Ordinance.

Section 11: The Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, that all deliberations of this Council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with the applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the ORC.

Section 12: That this ordinance shall take effect and be enforce from and after the earliest period allowed by land and upon confirmation by the Director of Development of the findings in this Ordinance.

EXHIBIT A

CITY OF KENT COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AREA II SURVEY

The City of Kent is hereby creating a Community Reinvestment Area (CRA II) in the western portion of the City along State Route 59. The district is generally defined on both the north and south by properties, in whole or in part, that front on, or are within 300 feet of, West Main Street, or front on North Frances Street. The district extends from the Summit/Portage County line on the west to approximately 150 feet northeast of the intersection of Haymaker Parkway and West Main Street in Kent, Portage County, Ohio. Exhibit B, the General Boundary Description Map defines the area graphically.

The area is represented by a mix of both residential and highway commercial land uses. The predominate zoning in the area is IC-R, Intensive Commercial—Residential; however, the CRA boundaries do include small portions of R-2, Medium Density Residential; and, R-C, High Density Multifamily Commercial Urban Residential. The current mix of residential to commercial land uses, within the CRA boundaries is approximately 20% and 80% respectively. Because of the high visibility of this segment of the City serving as the western entrance to the community, and recognizing the economic importance of the commercial contribution of the western end of the State Route 59 corridor which serves as home to many of the county's automobile dealerships, the recently adopted comprehensive plan highlighted this area as a Special Planning District. As such, the community as a whole has focused their attention on the redevelopment of this area, and has indicated a desire to devote resources to the developmental evolution of this important segment of the City.


The area consists of approximately 230 individual parcels, many of which are undersized and do not meet current subdivision regulations as buildable parcels. As such, many adjacent property owners, both commercial and residential, have purchased adjoining parcels to amass sufficient area to accommodate a variety development projects.

While many properties within the CRA boundaries are well maintained, and continue to serve their intended purpose, there are many structures, both residential and commercial, that are showing various levels of disrepair. In fiscal year 2004 there were eight Property Maintenance and other code violations within the CRA II boundary description area.

In conducting a windshield survey of the area, the following properties were specifically noted as being in a \cdot state of disrepair, and serving as a basis for the creation of CRA II:

- 1. 1210 West Main Street
- 2. 382 Irma Street
- 3. 936 West Main Street

All three of these properties have been identified as being in a state of general disrepair by the City's Code Enforcement Officer, and have been documented as such with photographs and letters noting the violations.

In accordance with Chapter 5709.83 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Housing Officer of a political subdivision is required to notify the local board of education of all applications for tax exemptions under a community's Community Reinvestment Area (CRA) program. The City of Kent has received a CRA II real property tax exemption application for the property listed below, which is located in the Kent City School District:

The applicant is requesting an exemption of 75% on the increase in the assessed valuation resulting from improvements to the real property. The owner is reporting a real property project costs of \$2,276,762.00 for the building acquisition and renovations; \$130,000.00 for machinery, equipment and furnishings; and \$12,000,000.00 in vehicle inventory. The maximum term of the exemption for this project is twelve (12) years, and it will be applied beginning with the first year for which the real property improvements will first be taxable were the property improvements not exempted from taxation, which is anticipated to be tax year 2026.

The City of Kent staff is proposing to recommend to Kent City Council the passage of an ordinance approving a CRA agreement with Pingree 2000 Real Estate Holdings for the requested exemption of 75% for a period of twelve (12) years. The presentation to Kent City Council will be held at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 5, 2025 in Council Chambers located at 319 S. Water Street, Kent, Ohio. Final legislative approval will be at the Council meeting held on November 19, 2025 at the same location.

Section 3735.671(A)(2) of the Ohio Revised Code does not require approval of an agreement by the local board of education prior to securing legislative authority to enter into the agreement if the amount of taxes charged and payable on any portion of the assessed valuation of the improvements "equals or exceeds twenty-five percent [25%] of the amount of taxes, as estimated at or prior to that time, that would have been charged and payable that year upon the real property had that property not been exempted from taxation."

RE: Community Housing Update

The City, in partnership with Kent State University, completed a *Comprehensive Community Housing Study and Needs Analysis* in 2016. Since it was completed, the data and research included in the study has been used by the Community Development staff to: 1) update the Zoning Code residential housing related regulations; 2) refine the City's housing programs offered to residents; 3) promote greater private investment in the types of residential housing development the community needs; and 4) to educate developers on the housing development concepts that have outpaced current and future demand.

The Housing Study's research and projections were through the current 2024/2025 academic period, so the administration has plans to issue a request for qualifications (RFQ) in early 2026 in order to hire a consultant to conduct an update to the housing study. The administration will use the study update to inform the next phase of the community's housing strategy that will include:

- Identifying current housing activity and unmet housing needs in the community and surrounding area:
- Evaluating the current inventory and where necessary, facilitating the redevelopment of existing under-utilized multifamily housing;
- Developing homebuyer programming that encourages the conversion of single-family rental properties into owner-occupied units.

I am respectfully requesting time at the November 5, 2025 Council Committee meeting to discuss the administration's plans for examining the current and future residential needs of the community in greater detail and to request Council's input as staff moves forward with the planned process in 2026.

Kent City Council has requested the administration contact Kent Social Services to determine the anticipated affect the ongoing federal government shutdown will have on local food pantry services. Currently, the USDA is reporting it will not provide contingency funding for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, which provides funding assistance for food acquisition to families with household incomes at or below the federal poverty guideline, which currently is \$32,150 for a family of four. The average SNAP monthly benefit is \$186.00 per household, per month.

Governor DeWine has reported that the State is looking at the issue, and a bill has been introduced in the Statehouse to provide stopgap funding for SNAP beneficiaries, but nothing has been formalized.

The Community Development Department has reached out to Kent Social Services staff and to representatives from its umbrella organization, Axess Family Services, to determine the anticipated increase in needed food assistance, but that information is not available yet.

Staff will continue their efforts to garner the information needed to determine the estimated increase in need for food pantry services and what level of financial support Kent Social Services reports it may need to provide additional food assistance if there is a lapse in SNAP benefits for the month of November.

I am respectfully requesting time at the November 5, 2025 Council Committee meeting to present the information received from Kent Social Services and to request Council's input as to how it wants staff to proceed on this matter.

The City of Kent receives an annual NOPEC Energized Community (NEC) grant each year and in March 2025, Council accepted the NOPEC grant award of \$50,733 and the administration reported to Council it planned to apply the grant towards the hiring of a consultant to assist with the locating, financial structure and implementation plan for a solar array (photovoltaic project) as part of a public/private partnership with the owners of 800 Mogadore Road.

The Community Development Department issued a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) in July for the photovoltaic project and selected Civil & Environmental Consultants, Inc. (CEC) as the consultant best qualified to provide the needed scope of services.

Appropriation of a portion of the NEC grant funds is needed in order to execute a purchase order for the consulting services. I respectfully request that \$45,000.00 of the 2025 NEC grant funds be appropriated to the Urban Renewal line 001.09.570.406.7340 (professional services) for the provision of consulting services for the photovoltaic project.

Please let me know if you need any additional information in order to include this item in the October 1, 2025 budget appropriations request submitted to City Council.

SUBJECT: Adoption of Cybersecurity Program

Background

Ohio Rev. Code § 9.64, enacted through House Bill 96, requires political subdivisions to set and adopt standards safeguarding against cybersecurity threats and ransomware attacks. This bulletin details the requirements of Ohio Rev. Code § 9.64, which are effective September 30, 2025.

Local governments, typically defined as "political subdivisions", have increasingly become targets for cybercriminals. They are vulnerable to cyber-attack schemes because of limited cybersecurity budgets, outdated systems and a range of accessible electronic and digital services. Cyber-attacks—such as ransomware, phishing, social engineering, and data breaches—disrupt government services, expose personal and financial information, incur significant costs, and reduce public trust.

Cybersecurity Program Compliance Requirements

Under this new law, each political subdivision's legislative authority **shall** adopt a "cybersecurity program" that safeguards the entity's data, information technology, and information technology resources to ensure availability, confidentiality, and integrity. *See* Ohio Rev. Code § 9.64 (C).

¹ Political subdivision is defined as a county, township, municipal corporation, or other body corporate and politic responsible for governmental activities in a geographic area smaller than that of the state.

The program shall be consistent with generally accepted best practices for cybersecurity² and may include, but are not limited to the following:

- Identify and address the critical functions and cybersecurity risks of the political subdivision.
- Identify the potential impacts of a cybersecurity breach.
- Specify mechanisms to detect potential threats and cybersecurity events.
- Specify procedures for the political subdivision to establish communication channels, analyze incidents, and take actions to contain cybersecurity incidents.
- Establish procedures for the repair of infrastructure impacted by a cybersecurity incident, and the maintenance of security after the incident.
- Establish cybersecurity training requirements for all employees. The frequency, duration, and detail of which shall correspond to the duties of each employee. Annual training provided by the state and the Ohio Persistent Cyber Initiative (O-PCI) program of the Ohio Cyber Range Institute, satisfies the training requirements. The O-PCI program delivered by the Ohio Cyber Range Institute (https://www.ohiocyberrangeinstitute.org/opci) and the Ohio Cyber Reserve (https://homelandsecurity.ohio.gov/ohio-cyber-integration-center/overview) includes online, hybrid and in person modules tailored to various types of organizations, from small to large, rural to urban and is funded by the State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program.

Political subdivisions should adopt a cybersecurity program/policy that is tailored to the unique environment/needs of their entity.

Reporting Requirements after Discovery of Cybersecurity or Ransomware Incident

Upon discovering a cybersecurity incident or ransomware incident, the legislative authority of a political subdivision shall notify both:

• The Executive Director of Ohio Homeland Security within the Ohio Department of Public Safety as soon as possible but not later than 7 days after discovering the incident. Incidents can be reported to Homeland Security's Ohio Cyber Integration Center (OCIC)

² Examples of generally accepted cybersecurity standards that entities use to build best practices for cybersecurity include, but are not limited to, the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) cybersecurity framework and the Center for Internet Security (CIS) cybersecurity best practices.

- The Ohio Auditor of State as soon as possible but not later than thirty (30) days after discovering the incident. Incidents can be reported to the Ohio Auditor of State via email to Cyber@ohioauditor.gov using the form located at: https://ohioauditor.gov/fraud/cybersecurity.html

Cybersecurity Incident Defined

A cybersecurity incident includes *any* of the following:

- A substantial loss of confidentiality, integrity, or availability of a covered entity's information system or network.
- A serious impact on the safety and resiliency of a covered entity's operation systems and processes.
- A disruption of a covered entity's ability to engage in business or industrial operations or deliver goods or services.
 - A disruption could include payment re-direct, payroll re-direct, spear phishing.
 Refer to AOS Audit Bulletin <u>2024-003</u> for additional examples.
- Unauthorized access to an entity's information system or network, or nonpublic information contained therein, that is facilitated or is caused by:
 - A compromise of a cloud service provider, managed service provider, or other third-party data hosting provider; or
 - o A supply chain compromise.

A cybersecurity incident does not include mere threats of disruption as extortion; events perpetrated in good faith in response to a request by the system owner or operator; or lawfully authorized activity of a United States, state, local, tribal, or territorial government entity.

Ransomware Incident Defined

Ransomware incident is defined as a malicious cybersecurity incident in which a person or entity introduces software that gains unauthorized access to or encrypts, modifies, or otherwise renders unavailable a political subdivision's information technology systems or data and thereafter the person or entity demands a ransom to prevent the publication of the data, restore access to the data, or otherwise remediate the impact of the software.

Ransomware Payment Only Permitted after Public Vote by Legislative Authority

A political subdivision experiencing a ransomware incident shall not pay or otherwise comply with a ransom demand unless the political subdivision's legislative authority formally approves the payment or compliance with the ransom demand in a resolution or ordinance that specifically states why the payment or compliance with the ransom demand is in the best interest of the political subdivision.

Public Records Exemption

Records, documents, or reports related to the cybersecurity program and framework, and reports of a cybersecurity incident or ransomware incident are not public records under Ohio Rev. Code § 9.64. Records identifying cybersecurity-related software, hardware, goods, and services, that are being considered for procurement, have been procured, or are being used by a political subdivision, including vendor name, product name, project name, or project description constitute "security records" and are exempt from the requirements to produce those records in response to a public records request.

Testing Compliance Requirements

Compliance procedures will be developed and incorporated into the Ohio Compliance Supplement.

In 2024, Kent Fire had a capital project to replace/remount our 2012 ambulance 2024KFD009. Due to delays in the manufacturing and supply industries, we were unable to complete this project in 2024. In July of 2025, the manufacturer took our ambulance to begin the remount process, which includes putting the existing patient area on a new Ford F550 chassis. This process takes 3-4 months.

Along with the manufacturer delays comes cost increases. Originally, we budgeted \$220,000. The latest estimate from this manufacturer is \$292,600. There is a difference of \$72,600. I am requesting a reappropriation of \$72,600 out of line 128.01.510.108.7630 (capital vehicle replacement fund). This will position us to be prepared when the remounted ambulance is delivered and invoiced. Feel free to reach out if you have any questions or concerns.

Dave,

I am requesting to change the City of Kent Codified Ordinance 137.18 (a). Throughout the years, the Kent Fire Department has maintained a residency due to the reliance on staff to be close in case of emergency call backs.

137.18 RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS.

(a) Employees of the Fire Department shall be required to reside within Portage County, or any county adjacent to Portage County, in the State of Ohio. (Ord. 2009-98. Passed 09-16-09)

While we do currently maintain a successful call back program, I am trying to balance the needs of recruitment and retention to remain competitive with other communities seeking to employ the best candidates. In addition, I want to ensure Kent Fire doesn't lose employees due to our current restrictive residency.

I propose expanding the residency requirement from adjacent counties to a new residency that includes Portage, Summit, Cuyahoga, Geauga, Trumbull, Mahoning, and Stark (existing), and adds to that Lake, Ashtabula, Columbiana, Carroll, Tuscarawas, Holmes, Wayne, Medina, and Lorain. The addition of these counties will continue to make Kent Fire Department a competitive and desirable place to work.



Economic Vitality

The Economic Vitality Committee creates programming to drive foot traffic to our businesses through "around town" events, promotions and activities, and develops opportunities for businesses to collaborate for the betterment of the downtown district as a whole.

Coffee Walk - In an effort to increase winter time foot traffic and bring some caffeinated joy to the community, MSK hosted the first ever Coffee Walk on Sat., Jan. 11. STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS FOR PROFESSIONAL CONSULTING SERVICES: PHOTOVOLTAIC PROJECT

The City of Kent's Climate Action Plan (CAP) directs the City to reduce greenhouse gas emissions within the stationary energy sector, which are generated by residential, commercial, industrial, and institutional energy use.

The CAP suggests a few strategies to help with reducing these emissions, two of which are expanding solar energy and finding ways to support local grid resiliency.

The City is very excited to share that it is moving forward with exploring a solar project to be sited at the 800 Mogadore brownfield site here in Kent.

Civil & Environmental Consultants, Inc. have been hired to help shape the project. They will advise the City on various design, installation, and implementation options, as well as on financing aspects of this public-private project.

Staff had their first introductory meeting with the consultants in late September, and the City will provide more information as the process moves along and updates become available.

There is incredible potential with this project to meet various climate action goals, including the added benefit of moving the currently vacant brownfield to productive use.

Davey's SEED Campus: A Living Lab of Sustainability

Davey Tree's SEED (Science, Employee Education and Development) Campus opened this summer, ushering in a new era for employee development and research. A walk around the 200-acre campus – the former site of Oak Knolls Golf Course – reveals a deep commitment to sustainability.

Stormwater Management

The SEED Campus manages its stormwater without any impact on the city of Kent with a three-acre stormwater retention pond, two water wells, and bioswales within the main parking lot. Bioswales are trenches full of moisture-loving vegetation that slow down rainwater and filter out pollutants, particularly salt.




Solar Arrays

A two-acre, 650-kilowatt photovoltaic solar array powers the SEED Campus, making it a net-zero site. It's also an evolving research laboratory where Davey Institute scientists are exploring low-maintenance, low-growth vegetation beneath the panels. Their findings are laying the groundwork for new sustainable best practices that Davey can offer clients.

Preserving Natural Resources

A nine-acre bog that lies at the north side of the property has been preserved in its natural state. It was important for us to keep this ecosystem because it's home to a wide variety of species and helps promote biodiversity.

Additionally, many mature trees from the golf course that once occupied the site have been carefully preserved and maintained.



Sustainable Turfgrass

All grass blends planted on the campus are A-LIST certified, meaning they require less water and fertilizer, while still maintaining high quality.



Pollinator Gardens

The campus's pollinator habitats – in peak bloom between June to August – are part of the Davey Institute's research plots. They were planted using a slit seeder, a method that minimizes soil disturbance and helps preserve soil carbon, and by drone.





Indoor Features

The main building includes low-flow plumbing fixtures, bottle refill stations, and LED lighting fixtures with occupancy and dimcontrol sensors. It also showcases several features made of reclaimed wood, including the barn/events space.



An Antidote for Environmental Despair From The Kent Environmental Council

Despair about the environment causes people to become depressed, numb, apathetic, overwhelmed, hopeless—often causing them to feel immobilized, stuck and unable to plan and move forward to solve our environmental problems. Because we have the impression that the planet is doomed, we do not register the growing array of scientific studies demonstrating the resilience of other species. Read on to find out some of the "bright spots" of research and also how whales now aid in the capture of 40% of the carbon produced.

In her book <u>Hope Matters: Why Changing the Way We Think is Critical to Solving the Environmental Crisis</u>, Elin Kelsey posits that "only if we believe there's an opportunity to make a real positive impact will we find the motivation to fight for the protection and restoration of ecosystems we depend on." And then she shares hope-filled success stories specific to watery ecosystems.

For example, in Western Australia up to 90% of live coral was lost to rising ocean water temperatures causing coral bleaching. But in some sections of the reef, 44% of the corals recovered within 12 years. Also, kelp forests that were attacked by three years of rising water temperatures recovered within 5 years. By studying these "brights spots" where ecosystems persist in the face of major climatic impacts, we can learn management strategies to buffer destructive forces and promote resilience.

Also, stories change over time. The Thames in London, England, was declared biologically dead in 1957, yet today is home to 124 species of fish and over 3,000 harbor and gray seals, as well as harbor porpoises, dolphins and whales; toxic chemicals have been removed for better water quality. Restoration works. (The Cuyahoga River here in Ohio is another example.)

Our attitudes also change over time, even toward species we most fear. In Monterey, CA, the sightings of one great white shark made news 20 years ago as a cautionary tale. But two decades later Monterey Bay is undergoing astonishing recovery thanks to world-class ocean conservation and new policies put in place decades ago. As the ecosystems grows healthier, white sharks and sea otters have returned and the Bay is healthier than in the past 200 years. The number of people surfing, boogie boarding, stand-up paddleboarding, diving, kayaking and swimming in those waters is also on the rise.

So, did more sharks and more people lead to more shark attacks? NO. The likelihood of being bitten by a shark dropped 91% between 1959 and 2013, despite the tripling of California's coastal human population. The US Marine Mammal Protection Act of 1972 led to an increase in elephant seal, harbor seals and sea lions—more animals that white sharks prefer to eat. Sometimes marine protected areas (MPA's) show results in just 3 to 5 years. Eight percent of the world's oceans are now protected.

The recovery of many marine mammals has been dramatic in general. For example, elephant seals were hunted to near extinction for their blubber in the 1800's and their total population in the North Pacific Ocean was down to 40 individuals by the end of the 19th century. And 60 years ago there were none in Ano Nuevo State Park Natural Preserve, near Santa Cruz CA. Today, there are 1,500 elephant seals at this park and 170,000 individuals in the North Pacific Ocean.

If we don't look to see if stories have changed, we miss huge things, like the impressive recovery of the California blue whale population, which is back to being almost the size it was before commercial whaling began. This is fantastic for all of us. People used to think that if the great whales returned, then all the fish would get eaten--but that isn't true.

It turns out that whales actually create conditions that help fish to thrive. Whales often feed at great depths, and as they return to the surface to breathe, they churn up the water column, spreading plankton and nutrients. They also often migrate long distances to mate, bringing nutrients with them to far latitudes where the water has fewer nutrients. Whales also produce vast amounts of poop rich in iron and nitrogen, which efficiently fertilizes microscopic phytoplankton upon which tiny marine animals feed. Fish in turn feed on these small creatures as well as phytoplankton. More whales equals more fish.

And that's not all! In 2019, researchers declared large baleen whales to be the "carbon capture titans of the animal world." Just one large baleen whale absorbs an average of 30 tons of CO2 throughout its lifetime. Part of their carbon capture capacity is due to that phytoplankton just mentioned. Whales increase phytoplankton productivity and phytoplankton produce 2/3 of the planet's oxygen. It captures 40% of all CO2 produced. Researchers tell us that the ocean's phytoplankton captures as much CO2 as 1.7 million trees (an Amazon rainforest's worth). If you add up the contribution of a single whale makes to carbon capture, the fishing industry and the whale watching economy, a single whale is worth \$2 million. That make the global population worth more than \$1 trillion.

Yes, "the vast scale, complexity, and destructive power of biodiversity loss, climate change, and countless other issues are real. Yet assuming a fatalistic perspective is not reality, and positioning hopelessness as a foregone conclusion is not reality." It is a widespread and debilitating mindset that not only undermines positive change, it squashes the belief that anything good could possibly happen. So keep hope alive. Do what you can. (Source: Hakai Magazine, www.hakaimagazine.com, January 18, 2021)

"Do not lose hope. If you surrender to hopelessness, you become indifferent and inactive. If you desire to preserve the beauty that still exists in this world...reflect on the choices you make each day. No worries – we got this! If you recall, in last quarter's article about my visit to the Oakwood Material Recovery Facility (MRF), I mentioned that there are easy ways to recycle the plastic bags/film that cannot be added to your recycle cart because of the danger they pose to the workings of the MRF system. This type of single-use plastic includes but is not limited to grocery bags, dry-cleaner bags, bubble and shrink wrap, air pillows, plastic shipping envelopes, and Ziploc bags.

Thanks to a plastic film recycling program called NexTrex®, our collections of plastic bags and packaging can be diverted from the landfill and live on to serve a whole new purpose. ⑤ The program is run by Trex®, a manufacturer of low-maintenance composite decking and railing made from 95% recycled materials - reclaimed wood, plastic film and sawdust, as well as eco-friendly outdoor living products.

Lucky for us, we have several options for participating in this recycling program.

First, drop off containers can be found at the following recycling partner locations:

Giant Eagle in Stow, Meijer in Stow, and the Portage County Solid Waste District Recycling Center.

Additionally, Trex® sponsors a Recycling Challenge Program that enables community groups to sign up and earn free Trex® furniture benches by collecting more than 1000 pounds of soft film plastics and packaging in a 12-month span. Groups that I have confirmed are currently collecting these materials here in Kent include:

Kent Lions Club – Collection on the last Friday of the month from Noon to 2pm in the Kent United Methodist Church's parking lot

Kent United Church of Christ – Drop off containers are inside the facility, please contact them for more information and/or access

Trinity Lutheran Church in Kent - Drop off containers are inside the facility, please contact them for more information and/or access

Unitarian Universalist Church of Kent – Drop off is located on the front porch of the Church's office building

If you know of other groups who are collecting, please let Julie Morris, the city's Sustainability Coordinator, know and we'll add them to the list.






